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Advancement Project is a next generation, multiracial civil rights organization. In California we champion the struggle for greater equity and opportunity for all, fostering upward mobility in communities most impacted by economic and racial injustice. We build alliances and trust, use data-driven policy solutions, create innovative tools, and work alongside communities to ignite social transformation!

After years of litigating civil rights, our founders started Advancement Project in 1999 to expand the tools available to end inequity and transform the large public systems that impact the lives of millions of Californians.

Our values of audacity, capacity building, collaboration, equity, innovation, and integrity guide our work for 21st century civil rights. We rely on data to drive evidence-based solutions, innovate technology and training tools to advance the field, build partnerships between ground-level advocates and the halls of power, and broker multiracial coalitions that reflect the state's changing demographics.

OUR PROGRAMS AND THEIR IMPACT

EDUCATIONAL EQUITY expands educational opportunities and ensures appropriate school facilities for low income and disadvantaged children from birth through high school graduation.

We showed the crisis in day care and preschool availability that five years of deep cuts have caused – www.SaveMySeatLA.org.

Through successful collaboration among several key Early Care and Education (ECE) groups, including Advancement Project, California passed one of the nation's largest early education programs – transitional kindergarten for 120,000 four year olds.

The “Water Cooler”, a statewide network of 500 ECE advocates and providers, ensures more coordinated and successful policy interventions with the Legislature.
